Minutes of the meeting

Welcome & Apologies

The 2009/10 Chair welcomed members and visitors to the meeting. Apologies were received from Ben Dewfall, Kamila Gebicka, Annie Pickering, Jens Newton, Lydia Stephens and Neil Bond.

Minutes of Last Meeting (Annual Review Session) - 6 September 2010

The minutes were agreed as being an accurate record.

Matters Arising

SDC Corporate Consultation Event – Members feedback

Seen by members as a land mark event between SDC Cabinet and Corporate Team and SDYC – 25 members attended and considered it really beneficial and were listen to by adults present who were enthusiastic about what young people had to say. Those in attendance voted unanimous to do it again next year, with consideration given to having more time to discuss each issue.

Autumn Training Event – Members Feedback

In addition to the evaluation already given by delegates at the end of the four day event, it was commented by a few that another similar teambuilding event should be run again before next autumn. Steve added that the majority of attendees were new members who experienced a fresh programme at a new venue, all worked very hard and feedback was generally very positive. It was hoped that another training event could be held before the end of March 2011.

Chairpersons Report for 2009/10 Year – Tom Lydon Chairperson 2009/10

Tom gave an overview of his report (which will appear in the 2010 Annual Review Report); this included his reflection on four years as a voting member, two and a half as Chair. He defined it as a privilege and honour to serve as youth councillor, whilst commenting on the last year as being a landmark one in terms of organisational development for SDYC. The review of the constitution was significant as was the continued development of local youth forums. With the litter recycling project fulfilling its aim and other key points, namely involvement in Tripswitch, concessionary bus fares campaigns and holding an official meeting with the local MP, much progress had been made and the impact of members hard work was hugely important. Tom gave thanks to Steve for continued support as the council's youth worker, referring to his role as the bedrock of the youth councils function. Tom wished everyone well in their roles and for the future.

Rosie thanked Tom for his excellent leadership and hard work as Chair, wishing him well for his immediate future at Leeds University and his career thereafter.

Correspondence

Gloucestershire 10:10 Awards

Freddie Whittaker, a former SDYC member had forwarded details of an award programme is being run by Gloucestershire Media which includes a category for Best Recycling Project – members agreed that the Litter Recycling Project should to be nominated for this. Steve would co-ordinate this by the 15 November.

Neighbourhood Watch Committee meeting – 24 November

Information on this meeting would be passed to the elected Youth Cabinet member for Community Cohesion to act as the SDYC representative on this committee.

Global Action Plan - Climate Squad

Details of two projects being run by Global Action Plan a national environmental charity, were received in relation to a volunteering programme being run by their 16 – 25 year old Climate Squad

group. Members were offered details of *Operation Pump it Up* and *Blackout* and asked to consider the work of this group.

Stroud Validate

SDC Community Safety Service are no longer running this young persons identity scheme for schools and youth groups, however they are willing continue to offer this to SDYC members as an 'in-house' opportunity. Some members expressed interest and suitable arrangements will be made to follow this interest.

Road Safety

A programme for information and educational purposes is being offered by the County Council Road Safety Unit for any groups wanting to find more out about specific issues of concern – this was promoted, particularly to local youth forums who were considering the issue in their area.

The Big Listen - British Youth Council survey on the Big Society

A big thank you had been received from BYC to all members who had taken part in the recent survey – over 1000 young people carried this out on behalf of their communities.

Test Purchasing with the Police

The opportunity to work with the Police and the local licensing authority on the issue of under age sales of alcohol is still being offered for those between 14 and 16 years old – members were asked to come forward as soon as possible to receive more information. Kathryn and Beth expressed an interest.

Equalities Act 2010

Members were briefed on the implementation of the Equalities Act 2010 which began in October. Details will be given to the Youth Cabinet for further consideration.

UKYP Elections 2011

Following the announcement of the Governments Spending Review, the UK Youth Parliament for Gloucestershire has postponed their elections for 2011 with view considering how the membership can operate in light of the local authority cuts. Robin, who is also current Deputy MYP for Stroud & Cotswolds, highlighted that a reduction from six to three members was being considered with local area elections still possible in the New Year.

One County One Voice Event – 25 October

Positive feedback on the event had been received from UKYP Gloucestershire; this included honest comments from SDYC members who attended. The presentations by Members of Youth parliament, the Police and the Debate in the Chamber were considered excellent, although workshops on transport and media training were considered by some as being poor.

Stagecoach West – Mega Weekend Ticket Offer

A special young person's mega weekend ticket offer is available for unlimited travel for £5.00, on all bus services in the county from 6pm on Friday 19 November to Sunday 21 November. This was in response to recent measures by various youth groups (including SDYC) to gain a better deal for young people regarding transport. Comments from members included the fact that no service ran from Wotton under Edge after 6pm and whilst it was a positive step, it needed to be carried out over a longer period.

Domestic Violence Awareness Event – 25 November

A half day event was being held on the issue of Domestic Violence – members interested in attending were; Millie, Becky, Beth, Roxy, Izzie, Abi, Chloe, Laura and Blake. More information would be sought and forwarded to these members.

Amendments to SDYC Constitution
