1. Welcome and Apologies

2. Minutes of the Last Meeting – 12th December 2016

3. Matters Arising

- a) Healthwatch Gloucestershire: Consultation on Doctors Surgeries Update (Steve)
 An update was given and draft copies of a young person's version of the survey will be circulated via email for amendment.
- b) Sustainability & Transformation Plan for Health Care in Gloucestershire Giving Feedback (All) Booklet will be sent via email and is to be completed by the group by the next meeting. Look into the possibility of Health & Wellbeing theme at the member's residential training event.

4. Correspondence

UK-wide survey: Politics and jobs 'swell youth anxiety' - Prince's Trust

Results from a recent survey from The Princes Trust, highlighted that political upheaval, job worries and low self esteem have left young people anxious and daunted. Following discussion, it was agreed that the report should be sent to schools and also be used as research for the SDYC Curriculum for Life Project. The information could potentially support a social media campaign and give direction for a local social action project – it could be a way for young people to look at opportunities.

Trip to UN Geneva

As a follow up to recent presentation and correspondence, further information on a future trip to the UN in Geneva was received from Zarin Hainsworth. The email containing information, schedules and deadlines for the trips will be passed on to members via email.

Only half of teenage girls in Gloucestershire say they are happy

Results from a Gloucestershire Live survey about issues impacting the mental health of children, highlighted the impact on teenage girls in particular. It was agreed that the Health Focus Group should take a look at the findings.

5. Elections

6. SDYC Member Training Residential Event

An update regarding details of the training was given along with a consent and expression of interest booking form. Training will take place Wednesday 15th to Friday 17th February 2017 and will include; team building, problem solving and focus group work. Booking forms were to be completed and returned by Monday 16th January 2017.

7. Updates from School & College Council's, Local Youth Forum Groups

Maidenhill School: Mock exams have taken place using the new grading system and the results were generally good. SDC's Leader attended the charity concert which raised £180 for Gloucester Baby Unit. The winter concert raised £350 and is being used to invest in the music programme. Students are still working towards the Japanese visit and the OFSTED inspection report was due next week.

Archway School: Year 11 mock exams are taking place. The musical production is coming up on 31st January. No school council meeting has happened yet in 2017.

Cainscross Youth Forum: A mental health video campaign 'what I'd like to know' is being filmed at local schools. The groups are having a meeting with Neil Carmichael (MP) on 27th January 2017.

Stroud High School: Next week is social media free week and plans are in place for students to participate.

Marling School: The art and drama building is being constructed. The Snow Ball ended after 45 minutes due to unforeseen circumstances.

Rednock School: 6th form mock exams are taking place. The mixed Winter Ball went well.

Cam & Dursley Youth Forum: The group are meeting this Thursday (19th January 2017) to progress with plans for their 'Kindness initiative'.

Katharine Lady Berkeley School: Mock exams are happening. Students will be attending a meeting regarding PSHE lessons – more details will be provided next time.

Chalford Cubed Youth Forum: Members visited Thomas Keble to promote their work during assemblies. Extensive promotional work for recruitment is being carried out. An action plan has been written for the Festival of Arts which is being led by the forum group.

Stroud Town & Five Valleys Youth Forum: The group has an event coming up on 13th February called 'Day in the Life of a Teen' – the programme and topics were discussed and all SDYC members were welcome to attend.

Berkeley Vale Youth Forum (Report given by Worker): The group has identified the issue of young people in their mid to late teens not having a place/building to meet and receive youth provision – work on this issue will evolve.

Hardwicke Youth Forum (Report given by Worker): A new forum group is emerging and they are currently meeting at Severn Vale School. An exhibition on 'Identity' is being planned and they are in the process of creating a logo.

Stonehouse Action 4 Youth (Report given by Worker): Efforts to redevelop a group is very informal and are currently focused on play sessions in surrounding villages.

Nailsworth & Minchinhampton Youth Forum (Report given by Worker): Work in this locality is currently based on a need to focus on young women's engagement with healthy activities and is aiming to get young girls active using yoga, circus skills and clubbercise.

Wotton Youth Forum: A series of concerts called 'EdgeFest' is planned for the next 3-4 months at the Under the

Edge Arts venue, with the first taking place on 27 January. Aimed at 14-18 year olds with a £1 entry fee, 50% of 'profit' going to Teens in Crisis.

8. British Youth Council (BYC) Report inc Regional Convention Report

George and Rebecca attended the recent BYC Regional Convention at City Hall in Bristol. Training was given on youth voice. The event looked at priorities and mental health was at the top. The event also developed a campaign to compliment the BYC Youth Select Committee and is entitled 'Freedom on Mind' - the festival has evolved into a large event and further information can be found on social media. NHS Youth Forum showed a presentation on how to influence their decision making.
