## Minutes of the Last Meeting - Monday 18th May 2015

#### **Matters Arising**

## A. Men and Mental Health Conference, Friday 26<sup>th</sup> June – Attendance Reminder (All)

A free conference which is held once every year; this year's theme is Men and Mental Health (9am to 4:30pm). Attendance is open to relevant practitioners e.g. youth workers and also young people. James Pain expressed an interest in attending.

## B. SDYC Website Development – Update (Steve)

An agreement had previously been made with SDC's IT Service, so as a new SDYC website can be produced this year. Work is yet to start but members will have the opportunity to give their input and help shape what the website will look like. The current website uses out of date software.

#### C. Youth Outline Understanding Radicalization Survey – Prevent Workshop (All)

Members had the opportunity to take part in a survey which was sent electronically. This survey, being run nationally, is trying to find young peoples opinions on the impact and understanding of radicalization and terrorism. Feedback highlighted that members thought the survey wasn't young person friendly. Further discussion was had on the potential of members participating in a 'Prevent Workshop', lasting only a few hours officers within the District Council can deliver this to SDYC - the majority of members present, thought it would be a good idea. Steve would look to set this up in due course.

## <u>Stroud Tenant Voice – Presentation from SDC Tenant Services</u>

The Chair welcomed Christine Welsh and Stuart Strathearn from SDC Tennant Services, who gave an overview of their service: There are 5,000 Council houses in the Stroud district, with larger estate's in the Stonehouse, Dursley and Stroud areas; however there are also pockets of housing in other rural areas. SDC Tenant Services have various sections inc. Asset Management, which deals with repairs and maintenance. The Council is keen to build new houses. Tenancy Management Team covers how rent is collected; there are housing officers within that team, covering community gardens etc. Tenant involvement is important because it allows the tenants to receive a good quality of services. A lot of the tenants will let us know what they want from the services. This includes giving opinions on their kitchen and bathroom refurbishments and deciding from a selection of flooring, interior colours, and doors.

A series of events organised by Tenant Services will take place in at community hubs across the district — the programme details are yet to be decided but are likely to include discussion on rents, help with budgeting and how

to receive benefits etc. Steve and Simon will promote these events to SDYC members and youth forums when the details are received for them. Opportunities to shadow the repairs team may also be available.

It was highlighted to Christine and Stuart that whilst the SDYC Principal Member for Housing (Lily Clarke) was not present at this meeting, she was interested in engaging with related matters. Members also expressed a desire to encourage young people's involvement, through SDYC and in particular local youth forum groups to consider the wider issues concerning youth housing.

#### Updates from Schools, Colleges and Local Youth Forums (All)

Archway - A cake sale for the Nepal appeal has been carried out recently.

**KLB** - The canteen is in the process of being refurbished. An art exhibition will be set up and open at school next week.

**Stroud High** – The development of a new toilet block is in progress. No student council meetings have taken place recently.

**Thomas Keble** - The school website is being updated soon – it is hoped that the school council will have an input into this development.

**Stonehouse Action 4 Youth** – Stonehouse in Bloom remains in focus for the group. Another coffee morning is being planned for the town, involving young people and older people.

**Maidenhill** – Open surveys from the student council are taking place; they are being sent out through the internal email system and will be undertaken by all students in their ICT lessons.

Chalford Cubed Youth Forum - Lily and Tom met with youth worker Becky Cassidy, last Friday and have a meeting planned with Emma Grove Designs to discuss the logo for the youth forum branding. Party in the Park event will be postponed, following a lower response than expected from adult's community groups. Communication with youth workers in the French Twin Village/town is on going. Work with local PCSO has seen possible dates proposed for speed-gunning.

**Stroud Town Youth Forum** – Youth worker, Becky Cassidy has contacted us and the next meeting will be arranged in the near future.

**Cainscross Youth Forum** – Whilst no official representation to SDYC has been agreed yet, session planning and recruitment is well underway.

# BYC/UKYP Youth Voice Convention – Report from event on 28<sup>th</sup> May 2015 (Steve, on behalf of George/Sophie)

George and Sophie attended the regional event as representatives of SDYC. It took place in Taunton bringing together representatives from a range of youth forums, youth councils and members of youth parliament across the south west. Taking place 3 or 4 times a year, the convention brings youth voices together to discuss issues and influence regional and national policy on a range of services.

The morning programme focused on young people's views on the Department of Justice in relation to crime and young people's experiences of both committing crime and being the victim of it – a representative from Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) from Devon and Cornwall attended. The opportunity for SDYC to discuss similar issues with the Gloucestershire PCC was highlighted – it was agreed this would be considered again in the near future.

There was a focus on mental health; workshops took place at the event, where by the issues covered by SDYC and Cam and Dursley Youth Forum were expressed.

Bristol City Youth Council is looking again at the issue of work experience - it was suggested that the SDYC

Employment and Training Focus Group communicated with them to seek any joint work.

A presentation from a project supported by Fixers, demonstrated how they made culture and heritage work for young people in their area.

George and Sophie met Esther Mounce, the new Stroud & Cotswold Deputy Member of Youth Parliament (DMYP), who expressed a keen desire to attend an SDYC meeting with Alysha Bodman, the new Member of Youth Parliament (MYP) to talk about subjects that the UK Youth Parliament want to cover over the next year. It was agreed this would be built into a future SDYC Main Meeting agenda as soon as possible.

## **British Youth Council Report (Charlotte)**

SDYC are a member organisation of the British Youth Council, hence the report at these meetings. Charlotte Bignell and Lily Clarke are our voting representatives. Charlotte reported on the latest news from BYC.

**Votes at 16** – The BYC have been campaigning since 1998 to lower the voting age to 16, and have now called for a meeting with the Prime Minister to put forward their case. Members were reminded that the SDYC consultation regarding political education included views on the issue of lowering the voting age, the outcomes are being considered by the Local Democracy Focus Group.

**Fairer voting system** – Member of Youth Parliament for Cornwall, Owen Winter spearheaded a petition which attracted the support of over 220,000 people regarding a campaign for a fair voting system. Support included that from political parties; Green Party, Plaid Cymru, SNP, UKIP and Liberal Democrats. It has now been handed to 10 Downing Street along with other petitions on the same issue, which totals nearly 500,000 people calling for a fairer system.
