The Chair welcomed everyone to the meeting. Member's apologies for absence were noted and are listed on the membership register above. Apologies also received from Cllr Miranda Clifton.

Minutes of the Last Meeting - Monday 14th December 2015

The minutes of the last meeting were agreed to be a true and accurate record. *Proposed by: Ollie King; Seconded by: Tom Schaffner.*

Matters Arising

a) Visit to Stroud by British Council Vietnam – report from 2nd December

A delegation from Vietnam (adults and young people) on an international study tour, was welcomed to an event at Ebley Mill, hosted by SDYC - Libby, Issy and Ollie K were present. Also present was SDC Chair, Cllr Mark Rees, and representatives from Bristol City Youth Council. Stroud Life and Gloucestershire BBC Radio also attended from the media. Good interactive discussions were had on youth voice projects and youth participation systems and structures in the respective countries, acknowledging the many differences, particularly in local rural areas. The event was deemed a huge success.

b) Clean for the Queen – further discussion

As discussed briefly at the last meeting, it is a litter pick event to clean up the country before the Queen's birthday. Scheduled dates: $4^{th} - 6^{th}$ March, SDC are leading a project team for a local effort – this is an opportunity for SDYC to get involved with the planning. Charlotte, Ollie K, Nyima and Tom S, expressed an interest to be involved.

c) SDYC 15 Year Anniversary – further discussion

Members discussed the possibilities of planning an event to mark the 15th anniversary of SDYC, but acknowledged that they were running out of time to mark the date. Ideas on raising the profile of SDYC and getting a project group together were suggested. All members present (bar James Preece) expressed an interest in being involved.

Election of Principal Members

a) Principal Member for Local Democracy

The following member had been nominated: Holly Abbott, voting member for Stroud High School. Proposed by: Alex Lin Vines; Seconded by: Libby Powell.

Manifesto – Holly Abbott – 'Having been an active member of SDYC for four years and a student passionate about politics, I believe that I can fully fulfill the job of being the Principal Member for Local Democracy. I've been a member of the Local Democracy Focus Group for two years and seen it develop into what it is now. I wholeheartedly hope I can help it continue to bring politics and democracy to young people of Stroud.'

b) Principal Members for Health and Wellbeing

No nominations were received.

c) Principal Member for Employment and Training

The following member has been nominated: *Tom Schaffner, voting member for Chalford Cubed Youth Forum*. Proposed by: Libby Powell: Seconded by: Charlotte Bignell.

Manifesto – Tom Schaffner – 'Over the past year, I have been the Principle Member for Employment and Training. During this time, we have built links with key people at SDC that coordinate work experience schemes, and have talked to employers on behalf of the Council. In the coming months, the group is hoping to meet local head teachers, to discuss the 'Curriculum for Life' initiative, as well as working closer to the Skills for Stroud programme to promote the benefits of good work experience. I hope that you will re-elect me as Principle Member, so I can continue to help these projects develop.'

d) Principal Member for Environment

No nominations were received.

e) Principal Member for Housing

No nominations were received.

Expressions of interest were given about the above vacant roles, but no nominations were received - therefore an email requesting future nominations will be sent again to members.

Election of Representatives to British Youth Council (BYC)

The two representative roles are elected every year. Responsibilities include; attendance at conventions and other key BYC events; receiving BYC weekly newsletters and reporting to SDYC at main meetings. Reps' previously been involved with lobbying, attending annual council events to vote and discuss issues in the constitution. It was agreed that elections would be included at next meeting.

UK Youth Parliament Update - Alysha Bodman, MYP for Cotswold and Stroud

Alysha updated members on her work over the five months: Attended annual sitting in Exeter, all MYP's met and discussed what they wanted to put on their manifesto, debated and voted the following day; Mind the Gap research relating to mental health services - researched all available services within the district and put together a report of all of the restrictions available and will be handed to the Minister for Social Care; attended the Department of Education Consultation on the A-Level and GCSE reforms - posted on Facebook page asking for people to come forward about the changes; met with the Gloucestershire Police and Crime Commissioner to discuss youth voice; initiated the 'Make your Mark' consultation - really proud as received 2,600 ballots, which were included in the South West total of 80,000 ballots; visited the House of Commons in November and debated the top five issues from the Make your Mark consultation - had a vote and the top two were mental health and tackling racism. Future commitments include: a meeting with Neil Carmichael MP (Stroud) and Geoffrey Clifton-Brown MP (Cotswold) on February 5th – any issues that SDYC would like Alysha to bring up, please let her know.

Update from School Councils, College Councils & Local Youth Forum Groups (All)

Maidenhill School – Plans are being made for Japanese students to come over in the future to spend a week at the school. The head teacher has given them £500 for the school council.

Archway School – Had a council meeting, complaints regarding the prices of food, manager of the food company met with them, questionnaires will be produced asking students what they would like to see.

Stroud High School – Currently discussing the election of two new deputy members.

Any Other Business

Member and Youth Forum Training

With changes made to the youth council year end and elections to SDYC now being held in January and February, it was felt that a new training programme should be developed. The following was suggested: introductory youth voice training to members of the local youth forums and the representatives from the schools and local youth forums that are on SDYC; greater input from current members on how to develop the programme and what it needs to feature; senior/experienced members would like to get involved with the actual training. It was also noted that a residential event always works better than one day events, as training can be spaced out over three days.
