1. Welcome, Introductions and Apologies

In the absence of the Chair, Vice Chair and Leader the group elected Tom Wickham-Bassett as the acting Chair for the meeting. Tom welcomed members to the meeting, particularly those attending for the first time. Acknowledging that a number of (now former) members had given their notice to retire, a quorum was present to enable decision-making to take place. Introductions were given by those in attendance. Apologies are listed on the record above.

2. Minutes of the last meeting on 22 November 2021

Minutes were formally presented and agreed as a true and accurate record. Proposed by: Brandon Watkins; Seconded by: Maxie Wells.

3. Matters Arising

a) Recruitment & Selection of new Youth Participation Officer

Steve gave an update on the process to recruit to the vacant youth participation officer role. The post was now being advertised across a wide range of recruitment platforms including the SDC website. The application closing date is 23 January, with shortlisting taking place soon after. Formal interviews will take place week commencing 31 January, followed by workshop based interviews involving youth voice representatives, scheduled for week commencing 7 February. The workshop based interviews will require approximately 10 youth voice representatives from across the district, to participate in this part of the process – those involved will subsequently have a significant input into the final decision-making ahead of appointing the successful candidate.

b) New Youth Voice Branding – Feedback on Design

Following feedback at the last meeting, amendments had been made to the new youth voice branding. An updated version was shared with members and general agreement was met on this latest version being acceptable. This branding would feature on new t-shirts for youth voice representatives.

5. Updates from School & College Councils and Local Youth Forum Groups

<u>Archway School</u> – Cate highlighted that she was preparing information about the youth voice representation opportunities to students, either to SDYC or a local youth forum group.

<u>Berkeley Vale YF</u> – no representatives were present.

<u>Chalford Cubed YF</u> – the group have begun meeting again in the parish offices and are trying to make links with Frith Youth Centre and Thomas Keble School, to re-launch their youth survey.

<u>Cam & Dursley YF</u> – the last meeting, featured a review on recent projects and activities regarding the Christmas programmes, at the Quarry Chapel in Cam and shop window competition judging in Dursley. There was also discussion on pedestrian safety in Dursley, this stemmed from the experience of needing to use the very narrow pavements whilst window judging, with the speed of traffic being an issue.

Cainscross YF – a brief tour around Ebley Mill featured in a recent session for the group.

<u>Hardwicke YF</u> – no representatives were present.

<u>Katharine Lady Berkeley School</u> – no representatives were present.

Maidenhill School – no representatives were present.

<u>Rednock School</u> – Morgan met the head teacher for a second time to further the discussion on efforts to kick-start youth voice in the school. Steve offered support on this.

<u>Stroud Town & 5 Valleys YF</u> – it was confirmed by the town council that their work regarding the 'bench project' had been held up, due to long-covid of relevant staff.

Wotton YF – no representatives present.

6. SDYC / GCRP Transport Group Report from meeting on 8 December

Maxie reported that, a small group of members had met with Hannah from Gloucestershire Community Rail Partnership. They went over, in more detail, the statistics previously presented to SDYC. They reflected on the work done and outcomes found so far. Their Kickstarter Officer was focusing on the findings relating to 'safety' and 'gender'. There would be more information to follow, once it's been made available – a suggestion from GCRP was to meet again in the future. Members agreed that SDYC's future involvement should be through a county-wide youth representative group, as previously suggested.

7. British Youth Council (BYC) Report

Cate attended the recent All Party Parliamentary Group (APPG) Youth Affairs online event regarding youth responses to COP26. Facilitated by the BYC, she was disappointed that no MP's were present, due to a covid related issue being discussed in parliament. It felt like there was little added to what was commonly known about already regarding COP26 outcomes.

8. Neighbourhood Watch Association Report from meeting on 22 November

Tom attended this meeting as the SDYC representative and highlighted that the meeting discussed crime in certain areas of the district, the promotion of their website and the 40th anniversary of Neighbourhood Watch. They are developing links with Deliveroo and the Hollie Gazzard Trust. The Police were promoting the new FLARE App regarding the reporting of inappropriate behavior and experiences relating to personal safety of women and girls. There was a focus on the theft of vehicle catalytic converters, plus scams regarding people impersonating police officers. Whilst he had no opportunity to report on the work of SDYC, he did enjoy listening to others in attendance. It was agreed to invite the SDC Neighbourhood Wardens to a meeting, to promote the FLARE App and discuss the matters relating to its use.
