1. Welcome and Apologies

In the absence of the Vice Chair and pending by-election of Chair, the Leader welcomed members and Cllr Miranda Clifton to the meeting. Apologies are listed on the record above.

2. Minutes of the Last Meeting – 17th December 2018

The minutes of the last meeting were agreed to be a true and accurate record. *Proposed by Tom Wickham-Bassett; Seconded by: Thomas Haynes.*

3. Matters Arising

a) Stroud Valleys Landscape Project / Walking the Land – Update

Following a request for more information on this project, Walking the Land expressed further interested in working with SDYC to produce work for their upcoming exhibition at the Museum in the Park, 28th March to 28th April. Creative Sustainability, the co-coordinators of community participation for the Canal Project have now also taken on work with this project. Involvement would now link the canal restoration to the wider landscape, including the Commons and the Nailsworth Valley. Writings, photographs, sound, drawings etc. that both express response to the places we walk and highlight the plight of other species. Members were left to consider this opportunity, with some expressing concerns that the provisional dates of 27th January and 18th February were incompatible with extra exam study particularly during the half term break. Unfortunately the small number of members felt they could no longer pursue this opportunity but thanked Stroud Valleys Landscape Project.

b) Sustainability and Environment Education (SEEd) Workshop – Update

The dates options for the workshop are, either; Monday 4th March or Monday 11th March – it will run from 4pm-6pm. The workshop will be an introduction to SEEd and to critical thinking and decision making, engagement, and modeling some of the deep thinking behind SEEd and how they bring about real change in the world. This will be an interactive workshop, designed to get youth councilors thinking about their roles and exploring new techniques and ways of thinking. It was agreed that 4 March would be most suitable.

c) Youth Voice Christmas Celebration Event – Feedback from 19 December

Most members who were able to attend, felt they got to meet other young people from different youth forums. It was relaxed and included a good presentation. It was good to hear what other young people were doing, good postcards, Christmas trivia, chosen teams, forfeits, pass the parcel and fancy dress.

4. Correspondence

Resignation - Lucia Oldbury

Lucia had decided that she should step down and let someone else take her role as she had not been able to commit as much time as initially thought. She hope someone else would take the opportunity on and help the council improve things for young people.

5. By- Election Results for position of Chairperson

Helen March and Tom Wickham-Bassett were both nominated for the post. Following an online ballot, Helen was elected as the Chairperson for the remainder of the year. Both candidates were thanked for their standing. Helen was congratulated.

6. Updates from School & College Councils and Local Youth Forum Groups

Cam & Dursley YF – Planned project ideas included research into the C-card scheme (condom distribution) and carrying out speed checks in community with PCSO's. They had recently met Dursley's Town Clerk and were hoping to meet with Cam Parish Council Clerk soon. A presentation to respective Parish Councilors and Town Councilors would also be planned soon.

Thomas Keble School – Discussion on a reducing plastic project suggested that the school should stop selling such items and move towards refilling containers. The school were looking to offer free green bottles at Receeption.

Stroud Town & Five Valleys YF – Reflective work had taken place to consider the groups identity. They had recently met with staff at the Town Council to further discuss the consultation on future plans for Park Garden.

Marling School – Unfortunately no student council meetings had taken place since September 2018. Support was offered to SDYC reps' to explore the reason for this non-action.

Nailsworth & Minchinhampton YF – Currently preparing presentation to Nailsworth Town Council regarding past, present and future projects. They had met the Clerk regarding the emerging cycle path project which stretches from Stroud to Nailsworth. The track needs refurbishing in most areas.

Archway School – Helen reported that she had still not been invited to Student Council meetings. The Council had recently met and discussed faith as a theme. The Sixth Form are focusing on mock exams and planning spring ball. A talk with David Drew was being planned. Helen was recently on Points West news. Year 11 are undertaking mock exams. The student council meeting today which SDC youth worker Rachael attended included discussion on health.

Stroud High School – Change of head girl leadership at half year point. Amelie asked for the student training day report (complied by SDC youth workers) in which to reflect on learning and recommendations.

Berkeley Vale YF – Preparation is under way for the Tales of Old Berkeley presentation and tour – it is hoped potential new members will emerge from this event.

Hardwicke YF – Finished consultation survey. Designing logo in a few weeks. Finlay has been elected as a new SDYC representative as deputy member.

Cainscross YF – whilst Cashes Green Community Centre is to be the new meeting venue for the group, some changes have had to be made to dates/times as another organization has extended their use of the venue.

Ofsted were also in attendance to discuss support for young people in schools. The Ofsted consultation was now available.

The campaigning workshop enabled reps' to meet Hanna Doherty, the member of youth parliament for Stroud and Cotswold's, she expressed a wish to attend an SDYC meeting in the near future.

The reps' revealed that they had nominated Steve for the Youth Voice Worker Award in the BYC Youth Voice Star Award programme – they had produced a film as part of the nomination. Following the showing of the film Steve was presented with the winners plaque. Steve thanked members for their nomination and expressed his surprise at the award. He will attend the national ceremony in March.
